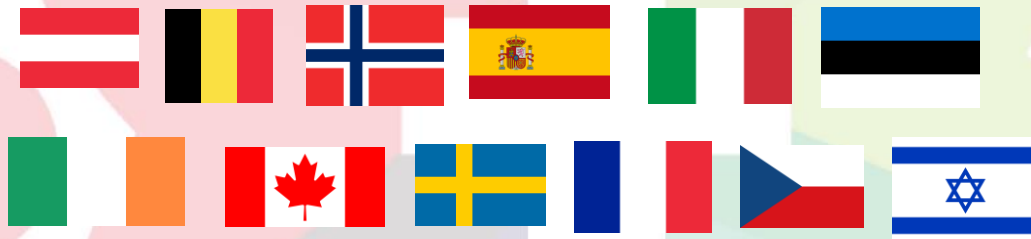

15 countries in total

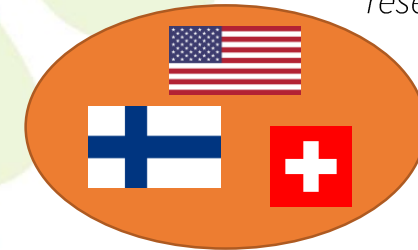


56 research performing organisations involved
